

Sklar Runs Production Pipe At Conecuh County Wildcat

Sklar Exploration Co., LLC, Shreveport, La., has run production casing at a Smackover wildcat one mile west-northwest of Brooklyn in southern Alabama's Conecuh County.

The company is waiting on completion rig to test the No. 1 Johnston-Stewart 32-12, NW SW Section 32-4N-13E. Hole was drilled to 11,940 feet. Shows were logged in Smackover and string of 5 1/2-inch casing was run to total depth for evaluation.

No details on shows or geological data are available.

Site of the potential discovery is

two and one-half miles south of Smackover oil production at Little Cedar Creek Field.

Rapad Drilling & Well Service, Inc., Jackson, Miss., handled contract.

The wildcat is located on a 160-acre drilling unit which includes the southwest quarter of Section 32-4N-13E.

Two and one-half miles north of the current wildcat, Midroc Operating Co. drilled No. 19-2 Cedar Creek Land & Timber, SW NE Section 19-4N-13E, on flank of Little Cedar Creek Field.

A Smackover completion, the well flowed 107 barrels 47-gravity oil and 79,000 cubic feet of gas per day through a 20/64-inch choke with flowing tubing pressure 140 pounds.

Completion was from pay in Smackover from perforations 11,664-684 feet. Total depth is 12,000 feet and 5 1/2-inch casing was run to bottom for completion.
