

Sklar Waiting On Rig To Evaluate Paluxy Wildcat In Baldwin

Sklar Exploration Co., LLC, Shreveport, La., is waiting on workover rig to evaluate shows logged in a Paluxy wildcat one and one-quarter miles southwest of Latham in southwestern Alabama's Baldwin County.

The No. 1 Nelson et al 35 in Section 35-2N-2E, was drilled to 9200 feet. Undisclosed shows were logged in the well and string of 5 1/2-inch casing was run to total depth for completion.

Drill-site is one quarter mile northeast of the discovery well for Latham Field.

D & D Drilling & Exploration, Inc., Ferriday, La., handled contract for drilling.

One-quarter mile southwest of the current test, Pruet Production Co. drilled No. 1 Nelson-Reynolds 34 in Section 35-2N-2E, discovery well for Latham Field.

Productive from Washita-Fredericksburg, the discovery pumped 186 barrels 28-gravity oil and four barrels water per day.

Completion was from perforations 8646-50 feet in Washita-Fredericksburg. The discovery was drilled to 9636 feet and 5 1/2-inch casing was run to 9631 feet for completion.

Elevation at the discovery was 129 feet, derrick floor. Top of Chalk was logged at 3930 feet, Base Chalk 5150, Lower Tuscaloosa 6280, Washita-Fredericksburg 7676, Ladner sand 8046, Paluxy 8450 and Mooringsport 9506 feet.

Latham Field produces oil from reservoirs in Dantzler and Washita-Fredericksburg.
