

Sklar Tests Discovery Well Near Uriah In Monroe County

Sklar Exploration Co., LLC, Shreveport, La., has tested a Smackover discovery one-half mile south of Uriah in southwestern Alabama's Monroe County.

Details of production tests will be released at a later date for the No. 1 L. L. Coley 24-16, SE SE Section 24-4N-5E. The well was perforated opposite pay in Smackover 14,524-535 feet. Tests were run January 21 but tests will be withheld temporarily.

Site of the wildcat is three miles southeast of Palmers Crossing Field and two miles southwest of South Uriah Field.

Rapad Drilling & Well Service, Inc., Jackson, Miss., handled contract.

The well is located on the same 40-acre unit that Cobra Oil & Gas Corp. drilled the No. 1 Blacksher 24-

16, SE SE Section 24-4N-5E. It was bottomed at 14,882 feet and abandoned in September of 1983. Geological data are not available.

Location is on a 160-acre drilling unit which includes the northwest quarter of Section 29.

At southeast diagonal offset to the indicated producer, Sklar earlier drilled the No. 1 Thomasson 29-10, NW SE Section 29-4N-13E.

Productive from pay in Smackover, the well pumped 525 barrels 48-gravity oil and 520,000 cubic feet of gas per day. No formation water was reported.

Production is from pay in Smackover from perforations 11,475-488 feet opposite pay in Smackover.

Hole was drilled to 11,768 feet. Shows were logged in Smackover and 5 1/2-inch casing was run to 11,715 feet for completion.
