

Production Pipe Run On South Flank Of Little Cedar Creek

Production casing has been run by Shreveport-based Sklar Exploration Co., LLC, on south flank of a southerly extension area to Little Cedar Creek Field in south Alabama's Conecuh County.

Sklar drilled the No. 1 Cedar Creek Land & Timber 34-14, SW SE Section 34-4N-12E, to a depth of 13,325 feet. Shows were present in Smackover and string of 5 1/2-inch casing was run to total depth for evaluation.

The well was drilled on a drilling unit of 160 acres which includes the southeast quarter of Section 34.

Rapad Drilling & Well Service, Inc., Jackson, Miss., handled contract for drilling.

About one-half mile north of the current well, Sklar Exploration recently completed the No. 1 Graddy 34-8, SE NE Section 34-5N-12E.

A Smackover completion, the well flowed 398 barrels 46.29-gravity oil and 350,000 cubic feet of gas per day on a 24/64-inch choke with flowing tubing pressure 175 pounds. Gas-oil ratio was 879 to one. No formation water was reported.

Production is from pay in Smackover from perforations 12,004-018 feet.

The well was drilled to a depth of 12,220 feet. Shows were logged in Smackover and string of 5 1/2-inch casing was run to 12,220 feet for completion.
