Two Smackover wells completed in Conecuh County by Sklar Exploration

Sklar Exploration Co LLC has finaled two vertical Smackover wells in the far southern portion of Conecuh County, Alabama.

Initial daily potential for the 1 Cedar Creek Land & Timber "35-10" (API 01-035-20236) was 277 bbls of 48-degree crude and 190,000 cu ft of gas through acid-treated perforations at 11,799-11,820 ft. On a 21/64-inch choke, flowing tubing pressure was 50 psi. Located about one-half mile north of the Escambia County line in the ne nw se 35-4n-12e, the new producer was drilled to a total depth of 12,080 ft. Five-and-a-half-inch casing is set on bottom.

One mile to the northeast, in the se ne nw of adjacent section 36, Fletcher Petroleum Corp completed a 531-bbl-per-day Smackover oil discovery in late 2010. The 3 Amos "36" was tested through perforations at 11,678-11,700 ft. The 11,968-ft well has yielded 24,821 bbls of oil and 21.47 million cu ft of casinghead gas during its first four months onstream.

Sklar's other newly completed well -- the 1 Mary Mack "31-2" (API 01-035-20233) -- is another one and one-third miles to the east. It was tested pumping 245 bbls of 48-degree oil daily through Smackover perforations at 11,622-11,648 ft. The new producer was drilled to a total depth of 11,927 ft in the c nw ne 31-4n-13e. Five-and-a-half-inch pipe is set two ft off bottom.

Sklar and Midroc Operating Co have been actively drilling the Smackover in this portion of Conecuh County, which is just south of the rapidly expanding Little Cedar Creek field.
