

Offset To Discovery Perforated By Sklar In Conecuh County

Sklar Exploration Co., LLC, Shreveport, La., has perforated in Smackover at an offset to a recently completed discovery in the Melrose area of southern Alabama's Conecuh County.

The No. 1 Craft-Smurfit-Stone 27-12, NW SW Section 27-5N-13E, was perforated in a 33-foot interval at 10,641-674 feet.

Testing is underway with no results yet available.

Drilled to a depth of 10,811 feet, shows were logged in Smackover and string of 5 1/2-inch casing was run to 10,807 feet for evaluation.

Drill-site is one and one-half miles northwest of Melrose and one and three-quarter miles southeast of Mt. Union. It also lies one and one-half miles north-northeast of Smackover oil production at Little Cedar Creek Field.

Rapad Drilling & Well Service, Inc., Jackson, Miss., handled contract.

Slightly less than three-eighths of a mile north-northeast of the current test, Sklar completed No. 1 Craft-Soterra 27-6, SE NW Section 27-5N-13E. The well flowed 577 barrels 48-gravity oil and 312,000 cubic feet of gas per day through a 22/64-inch choke with flowing tubing pressure 925 pounds.

Production is from perforations 10,597-616 and 10,619-626 feet in Smackover.

The discovery was drilled to 10,710 feet. Shows were logged in Smackover and string of 5 1/2-inch casing was run to 10,710 feet for completion.
