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Sklar, Pruet continue Smackover drilling programs in southern Alabama

Two more Smackover tests have been drilled along the eastern edge of Alabamas Brooklyn field.

In southeastern Conecuh County, Sklar Explorations 1 Cedar Creek Land & Timber 3-7 (API 01-035-20344) reached a total depth of 11,950 ft with production casing set to an unreported depth. The expected Smackover oil well was directionally drilled in the se nw ne of section 3-3n-13e.

A half-mile to the northeast is Pruet Productions 1 Cedar Creek Land & Timber 35-13 (API 01-035-20345). The 12,025-ft test was perforated in the Smackover at 11,625-11,715 ft with no other details reported. Pruets test was directionally drilled in the nw nw nw of section 2-3n-13e, bottoming to the northeast beneath section 35-4n-13e.

Onstream since 2007, Brooklyn field has recovered 16 million bbls of oil and 16.8 billion cu ft of gas through mid-2016. More than 70 active wells in the Smackover field currently produce through perforations at around 11,300-12,200 ft. The most recent well in the reservoir was brought online in April. Fletcher Petroleum's 2-5 Findley was tested flowing 350 bbls of 47.7° crude and 84,000 cu ft of gas per day through perforations at 11,580-11,594 ft.

The adjacent Little Cedar Creek field was brought online in 1994. Pruet and Sklar operate the bulk of the oil wells in the Smackover reservoir.
