

Paluxy Oil Discovery Completed By Sklar In Baldwin County

Sklar Exploration Co., LLC, Shreveport, La., has completed in Paluxy at a wildcat in the Latham Field area of southwestern Alabama's Baldwin County.

The No. 1 Nelson et al 35 in irregular Section 35-2N-2E, was completed pumping 245 barrels oil and 99 barrels water per day. Production is from perforations in Paluxy at 8057-60 feet.

Total depth is 9200 feet. Shows were logged in Paluxy and string of 5 1/2-inch casing was run to 9200 feet for completion.

Drill-site is one-quarter mile northeast of the discovery well for Latham Field.

Latham Field produces oil from reservoirs in Dantzler and Washita-Fredericksburg.

D & D Drilling Co., Ferriday, La., handled contract.

Latham Field was opened by Pruet Production Co. at No. 1 Nelson-Reynolds 35, Section 35-2N-2E. The discovery, located one-quarter mile southwest of the latest producer, was completed pumping 186 barrels 28-gravity oil and four barrels water per day.

Completion was from perforations 8040-50 feet in Washita-Fredericksburg. The well was drilled to 9636 feet and string of 5 1/2-inch casing was run to 9631 feet for completion.

Elevation was 129 feet, derrick floor. Top of Chalk was logged at 3930 feet, Base Chalk 5150, Lower Tuscaloosa 6380, Washita-Fredericksburg 7676, Ladner Sand 8046, Paluxy 8450 and Mooringsport 9506 feet.
