Paleozoic wildcat staked in Conecuh County by Fletcher Petroleum

Gulf Shores, Alabama-based Fletcher Petroleum Corp has permitted a wildcat in the far southeastern portion of Alabama's Conecuh County, one mile east of Escambia County and nearly three miles west of Covington County.

Plans call for the 4 McMillan "15" (API 01-035-20248) to be vertically drilled to an undisclosed depth in the Paleozoic. The new venture is located in the se nw nw 15-3n-13e.

The nearest recovery is in neighboring Escambia County, two and one-third miles to the northwest. Sklar Exploration Co LLC tested the 1 Logan "5-7" in 2008 pumping 21 bbls of 47-degree oil and 57 bbls of water per day through acid-treated perforations at 11,820-11,832 ft in the Smackover. The 12,225-ft wildcat has produced 10,644 bbls of crude, 5.3 million cu ft of casinghead gas and 1,014 bbls of water, including April 2011 output of 190 bbls of oil, 222,000 cu ft of gas and three bbls of water.

The newly permitted test is roughly four miles south of Little Cedar Creek field, a rapidly expanding Smackover oil pool in Conecuh County, where several companies are conducting drilling programs.

Fletcher is waiting on completion tools at its 1 Godwin "36" (API 01-035-20244) in the sw ne ne 36-4n-12e. The wildcat was drilled late last month to a total depth of 11,950 ft in the Paleozoic.
