

Sklar Resumes Testing Smackover Well Near Little Cedar Creek

Sklar Exploration Co., Shreveport, La., has resumed testing operations at a Smackover well one and one-quarter miles west of Melrose in southern Alabama's Conecuh County.

Perforations were reported at 11,034-052 feet at No. 1 Craft-Ralls 33-15, SW SE Section 33-5N-13E. At latest report the company was preparing to acidize.

This well was initially perforated 11,094-113 feet but testing failed to establish commercial production.

This well was drilled to 11,282 feet and 5 1/2-inch casing was run to total depth. Initial perforations at 11,094-113 feet were acidized and an overall interval from 11,094 to 11,132 was perforated for squeeze.

About 1500 feet west-southwest of the proposed bottom hole of the currently testing well, Sklar earlier completed No. 1 Craft-Ralls 33-14, SE SW Section 33-5N-13E.

Productive from Smackover, the well flowed 395 barrels 40-gravity oil and 382,000 cubic feet of gas per day through a 17/64-inch choke with flowing tubing pressure 440 pounds.

Production is from Smackover perforations 10,926-956 feet. Total depth is 11,100 feet and 5 1/2-inch casing was run to total depth for completion.
