Fletcher finals Smackover well in Alabama's Brooklyn field

Fletcher Petroleum has completed a Smackover well in southern Alabamas Conecuh County, extending Brooklyn field to the east.

The 2-5 Findley (API 01-035-20343) was tested flowing 350 bbls of 47.7° crude and 84,000 cu ft of gas per day through acid-treated perforations at 11,580-11,594 ft. Flowing tubing pressure was gauged at 622 psi on a 14/64-inch choke. The 11,946-vertical well was drilled in the ne sw nw of section 2-3n-13e.

Less than a quarter-mile to the northwest in section 3 is Sklar Explorations proposed 1 Cedar Creek Land & Timber 3-7 (API 01-035-20344). The Brooklyn field test is scheduled to be directionally drilled to a total depth of 13,135 ft, or 12,102 ft true vertical depth.

Fletcher Petroleum and Sklar Exploration are among several operators with Smackover drilling programs in Brooklyn field and the adjacent Little Cedar Creek field.

Onstream since 2007, Brooklyn field has recovered 14.9 million bbls of oil and 15.3 billion cu ft of gas through February 2016. More than 70 active wells in the Smackover field currently produce through perforations at around 11,300-12,200 ft.

The adjacent Little Cedar Creek field was brought online in 1994. Through February, production in the Smackover reservoir totals 19.8 million bbls of oil and 26 billion cu ft of gas.
