

# **Sklar Spots Hosston Test In Smith Near Sullivan's Hollow**

Sklar Exploration Co., LLC, Shreveport, La., will evaluate Hosston at a wildcat in the Sullivan's Hollow area of southeastern Mississippi's Smith County.

Scheduled for a depth of 14,600 feet is the company's No. 1 Johnson 20-2, NW NE Section 20-10N-15W. Drill-site is about one-half mile northwest of the discovery well for Sullivan's Hollow Field.

Nabors Drilling USA, Houston, Texas, will handle contract for drilling.

About one-quarter mile south-southeast of the new location, Hughes Eastern Corp. drilled No. 1 Johnson-Federal Land Bank 29-1 NE NE Section 20-10N-15W.

Bottomed at 14,500 feet, shows were logged in Mooringsport, Paluxy, Rodessa and Sligo and string of 5 1/2-inch casing was run to 14,488 feet for evaluation.

A series of perforations between 12,313 and 13,605 feet failed to indicate commercial production and hole was abandoned in 1987.

Elevation was 349 feet, derrick floor. Top of Lower Tuscaloosa was logged at 8682 feet, Paluxy 10,816, Mooringsport 12,276, Base Ferry Lake Anhydrite 12,838, Sligo 13,592 and Hosston 13,821 feet.

Cobra Oil & Gas Co. and Paramount Petroleum Corp. opened Sullivan's Hollow Field at No. 1 McDaniel 21-6, SE NW Section 21-10N-15W. Productive from a series of perforations in Rodessa between 12,916 and 13,062 feet, the discovery was completed flowing 2,169,000 cubic feet of gas, 251 barrels 53.5-gravity condensate and one barrel water per day on an 18/64-inch choke with flowing tubing pressure 1550 pounds and casing pressure 1000 pounds.

Hole was drilled to 13,300 feet and cased to 13,289 feet.
