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Par Minerals schedules more drilling in Pike County, Miss.

Shreveport-based Par Minerals Corp has permitted two more Lower Tuscaloosa tests in Mississippi's Parker Lake field, a Pike County reservoir opened by the operator late last year.

The 1 Talley 28-3 (API 23-113-21062) is scheduled to be drilled to a total depth of 11,500 ft in the s2 nw se of irregular section 28-4n-7e. The city of McComb is one and one-third miles to the southeast.

Over half a mile to the northwest is the company's 1 Rogers 28-5 (API 23-113-21063) in the c sw nw of the same section. Total depth is also 11,500 ft.

Par Minerals tested the Parker Lake field opener, the 1 Parker 28-2, flowing 140 bbls of 42° oil per day through perforations at 10,952-10,964 ft. The top of the Lower Tuscaloosa was logged at 10,900 ft. The 11,160-ft well was drilled over a mile and a half west of the Summit city limits.

Par Minerals has been active in Pike County since 2013. Currently, the company operates four wells, all of which are in Summit field to the northeast. Cumulative recovery from Pars producers totals 111,101 bbls of oil and 7,451 bbls of water, including August output of 2,382 bbls of oil and 146 bbls of water. Summit field has been producing from the Lower Tuscaloosa since 1959.
